
Advent Hope

Calendars, datebooks schedules and alarm clocks exist to remind us that we can easily be overwhelmed by the rush of time and events. this season -- the season of Advent. There are always four Sundays in the worship season of Advent, and each Sunday has a special theme. The themes, in order, are Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. Hope is more closely bound to the dimensions of time than the other three themes. Hope has its roots in the past. Hope is acted out in the present. HOWEVER, hope is primarily identified with and shaped by the future. Hope calls to us from the future and invites us to move forward into that which we do not yet know, but trust is, or will be there. For us, as Christians, the origin of our hope is God. God, who is always ahead of us, invites us to come into the future God is preparing. God has never called people to the past. God always calls us into a future that is not quite yet but is in the process of becoming. Just as we are also in the process of becoming so is our future. Now our hope is fed by remembering the faithful ways God has dealt with us in the past. Our hope is strengthened by being aware of God's presence with us in the here and now. And our hope is empowered by the promise of what shall be and that we shall be a part of it. Because we know that God has been faithful we can open ourselves toward the future and live in HOPE!

I look forward to seeing you Sunday so we can worship God together and strengthen our HOPE! The Yah Yah's are going to dinner and then to the Creighton Theater December 15 to see "Miracle on 34th Street."


"Miracle on 34th Street"
